001	The Council resolved to accept apologies from Clir Mellor for family reasons.
002	DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS - none declared.
003	The Council resolved to approve the MINUTES of the meeting held 9 March 2015 at War Memorial Half, Cleeve Prior.
004	WCC CLLR REPORT: Cilr Adams reported the following: A. Budgets have been approved at both County Council & District Council for 2015/6.
	B. There is a county wide move by academy schools to hold public consultation on whether to add a year 6 thus making them align with first schools in Gloucestershire and Warwickshire. This is causing widespread concern in middle schools as it will affect their funding. Everyone is asking all schools, high, middle and first schools, to work together to find a solution. News this month - Pershore School voted against taking on an extra year, and Littletons School has decided to defer a decision pending any outcome from the discussions on a pyramid plan with the middle school.
	C. WDC won another major planning appeal this month (making it 3 in a row) and the planning inspectors are agreeing that WDC do have a 5 year housing supply. This is a big step forward and should help prevent any more unwanted new housing development in our villages in Wychavon.
	O. Number of burglaries in the area: This was discussed at length at the recent Police Liaison meeting (PACT), and the police are concentrating on this issue, and there is a task force working on it. I also wrote to the police commissioner. The main point for all residents is to stay vigitant and to note down any registration numbers of suspicious vehicles in the area.
	E. Superfast Broadband scheduled in Cleeve Prior for the end of Sept 15, but may be installed sooner.
	F. Roads to be dressed on 11 & 12 April. Road painting to be completed afterward, but in general this work is on a schedule.
	G. Traffic Survey for Main St and Evesham Road requested.

Clearance 03.14: The Clerk emailed a letter to G Albutt on 24.02.15 and requested a solution to resolve the CPO Land conflict. On 02.03.15 an email reply was received; G Albutt believes the works have been carried out as per the quotation. In an 11.03.15 letter the Clerk requested a meeting to resolve the situation; no reply to date. Chair Howe made two visits to G Albutt who wasn't home, but to date no return call or reply.

Refuse 02.15: On 17.02.15 the Clerk requested WDC to provide more bins for the Twin Oaks residents and conduct refuse pick at individual properties. During an email thread P Childs stated that the Travellers do not want individual property pick up and that providing more bins to residents would result in a charge per bin. The option of a free industrial size bin at the top of the CPO Land is a consideration. If bin is installed, no loose bags will be collected and CPPC will require WDC permission to remove the bin. ACTION: CIIr Brown to investigate the possibility of creating a turn-around point for rubbish forries.

Cleeve Prior NDP: Due to the outcome of the meeting between CPPC and the NDP Working Party on 07.04.15, the Council resolved to take an emergency decision and approve the NDP Consult document with the amendment made to section 5.52; such as accommodation for the elderly is removed from the document.

The NDP Workin Party will meet with the planning consultant on 15.04.15 to discuss the best way to conduct the parish consultation. It is expected that an 8-10 week parish consultation period will commence shortly after the meeting. All parishioners will have the opportunity to comment and put forward ideas for policy statements.

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NOTES OF PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

 Parishioner concerned about outcome of 11 March Tettow King meeting. A substantial cross section of the village attended the meeting and an overwhelming number put their hands up in favour of the principal of the meeting; it should therefore be taken notice of and not dismissed.

The Parish Council should represent the views of the village as a whole and do not have the right under these circumstances to brush the issue under the carpet.

They have tasked the NDP to look into the future of the village and this issue (whilst arriving late for the plan) right or wrong have an enormous impact and have clearly caught the imagination of a large section of the village.

I feel that either the Parish Council or the NDP have the responsibility to at least organise a formal meeting or a questionnaire to assess the real feelings and also grant the Village the chance to debate this major issue.

There were several responses from clirs to the effect that:

- A. Tetlow King called the 11 March meeting and to date there has been no correspondence to the Council offering a synopsis of the meeting or evidence of parishioner support for the proposal.
- B. Any policies in the NDP must comply with SWDP and national planning policy. Therefore, this matter is not solely an issue of parishioner support.
- C. The Council and the NDP Working Party have engaged Tetlow King via letters, phone calls and meetings.
- D. Tetlow King will have the opportunity to respond during the Consultation period which is likely to commence some time shortly after 15 April.
- 2. Parishioner concerned that the draft NDP has not been made public; this is causing anxiety amongst parishioners.
- Parishioner concerned about the state of the playground.
