It is good news to hear that the churches in and around Badsey are welcoming friends from their German partner parishes in the month of August. This partnership link has been going for several years, and I know that long-standing friendships have been made. It is part of a wider link that the diocese of Worcester has with the church in the eastern part of Germany, a link which began more than thirty years ago at the time when the Berlin Wall came down.

There were great hopes then as the countries of the former Eastern bloc and the West came together, and walls and political systems which had separated families and friends for decades began to crumble – all the more tragic then, that those divisions have arisen again with the war in Ukraine.

What difference might such a partnership visit as this make in our divided world? For the Christian it is a reminder that our ultimate loyalty is to God, rather than one political set-up. They come here as our brothers and sisters in Christ. Our faith unites us.

It is also part of our calling, in the words of Pope Francis, to build bridges rather than walls. Human beings flourish most of all when they are in community, and we need other people to become the people we are meant to be. Archbishop Tutu described the African concept of *ubuntu* like this: 'I am a person through other people. My humanity is tied to yours.'

So this partnership visit from Germany to England is one small way of building bridges, and learning more about ourselves by welcoming others. Come and meet them, please join in – it will certainly be enjoyable.

Cleeve Prior Telephone Box

The telephone box opposite the village green was purchase by the Parish Council for the princely sum of £1 through BT's 'adopt-a-kiosk' in the 1980's, it has stood unused until the Coronation of His Majesty, King Charles III this year.

The iconic telephone kiosk was the result of a competition in 1924 and was designed by British designer Sir Giles Gilbert Scott. The phone box was introduced by the Post Office to help increase communication around the country.

Our box is a K6 and was introduced in 1935. Designed to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of King George V, it bears a Tudor crown. The next display in the box will have a picture of the seat and tree planted on the village green to celebrate King George's Silver Jubilee.

At a recent Parish Council meeting it was proposed to encourage the use of the telephone box for displaying subjects/times of interest from individuals or village groups. If you have any ideas for a display, please contact me and I'll be happy to help.

The next display will be going up soon and I hope you enjoy looking.

The Annual Village Cricket Match Upper Cleeve v. Lower Cleeve, Sunday 16 July



The annual village cricket match was held on Sunday 16 July, in memory of the 11 men from Cleeve Prior who lost their lives in the two world wars. In keeping with tradition Mike Walker rang the church bells 11 times, whilst our compere for the day, Ian Robinson read out the names of the fallen men.

The teams faced not only battle between Upper Cleeve and Lower Cleeve, but also against the weather forecast and the potential number of spectators due to the timing clash of the Wimbledon men's final. Luckily the weather remained dry, and villagers turned up to support the event in their droves.

This year Upper Cleeve were looking to retain the trophy they won last year whilst Lower Cleeve. having assembled a strong team, were looking to take the win. It was great to see that within the 18 players who volunteered to play, there were some new faces to the village. Duncan Harvey, the Upper Cleeve captain won the toss and play got underway with lower Cleeve batting first. Although scoring was

proving difficult as the longer grass was making for a slower wicket, Lower Cleeve got off to a promising start.

It was lovely to see grandfather and grandson pairing of Colin Taylor and Luke Thomas open. Soon Upper Cleeve's bowlers made steady progress pinning back the batters, young Luke finally having to retire not out, having reached 20 runs. Everyone managed to have a bat and, with a couple of overs left, Luke was able to come back to bat. Lower Cleeve managed to score 80 runs.

After a short break the players took to the field. Some fine bowling and fielding took a few early wickets, but Duncan steadied the batting to put on a fine 20 and then forced to retire due to the rules. Upper Cleeve began to pile on the runs, scoring plenty of boundaries. The game saw some excellent fielding from Lower Cleeve and notably a fine run out by David Davenport. With 3 overs left, Upper Cleeve seemed to have the game in the bag. Duncan returned to the crease and with only a couple of runs needed and an over to spare, Mike Heelis faced the bowler confident of the win. He struck a fine shot, only for it to go for a six, meaning he was out. Match tied.

This was a fair result on the day, meaning Upper Cleeve retained the trophy.

I would like to thank everyone who helped out at the event to make it so successful. In particular, the volunteers who set up the event in the morning and broke it down after the match, Keith Richards who umpired, Lis Hughes and Judy Winters for scoring, Field Barn for putting on the BBQ, and the Memorial Hall for the bar. A special thanks to Julie, my wife, for mowing and preparing the wicket, and of course to the players.

Additional thanks to all of you who turned up to spectate and for raising much needed funds for Field Barn and the Memorial Hall.

The Cleeve Prior NWR Group have been taking a break during July as we had two events in June.

Our first outing was a visit to the Northwich Arms, an 18th Century former coaching inn situated beside the River Avon in Evesham. We were attending an event hosted by Evesham Festival of Words entitled DNA Detectives. The speaker was Turi King, an expert geneticist from the BBC Series DNA Family Secrets. Her entertaining and enlightening talk covered the rise in the use of DNA in genealogy and forensics, for everything from tracing long lost family members to catching criminals. She spoke to us about her best-known work which involved cracking one of the biggest forensic DNA cases in history – the genetic analysis which led to the confirmation that the body discovered in the Leicester Car Park was indeed that of King Richard III.

We also heard about one of the cases she worked on in DNA Detectives and I suspect there was not a dry eye in the audience after she showed us a clip from that series.

Our next trip was to Sezincote House and Gardens only a week later! Members were looking forward to the visit following the talk given to the group in April by Professor Nicola Watson about Orientalism in Gardens with special reference to Sezincote. We were not disappointed. It was a beautiful day and the House and Gardens were enchanting. Sezincote is the only authentically Mughal palace in Northern Europe and was the inspiration for the Brighton Pavilion. It is still a family home and the house and estate are very much family run. Our house guide was excellent and brought the stories of the house to life. Tea and cake were enjoyed in the lovely, curved Orangery Café. An NWR outing would NOT be complete without Tea and Cake.

Our next planned meeting is on 17 October when we will hear from Sue Ablett, the organiser of Evesham Festival of Words and her subject will be "Bums on Seats" - basically, how she organises a huge event like the Festival of Words. The following month will see the NWR
