At the February Parish Council meeting, planning application No. W/22/02682/OUT for the development of Evesham Road traveller site was discussed.

The meeting was well attended. After a good deal of discussion, the Parish Council (CPPC) resolved to respond to Wychavon Planning on three key points:-

1. The Council support development of the site for housing.
2. The proposed number of houses in the current application at 114 is too many and should be returned to the original proposal of 84 houses.
3. The proposed use of CPPC land for a flood control balancing pond is not supported in the current plan.

Now that these issues are clear, the CPPC will attempt further discussions with the developer and Wychavon District Council. A public meeting hosted by the developer is to be held on 22 February.

Please note that Local elections are scheduled for 4 May. A major change this year is that photo ID will be mandatory in order to vote. If

you do not have this you can register for FREE ID on the following website. www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate

Please note that the April CPPC meeting has been delayed to 17 April to avoid a bank holiday.

What's new at the Trust?

Those walking down Quarry Lane will see that the battle against the scrub is continuing. We have decided to trial a digger to get out the stumps and roots which are at present making the whole area rather hazardous. Fortunately, we can see how beautiful it will look despite the short-term challenges. It makes the hard work worthwhile. As I said last month: **Please Note This Area is Not Safe for pedestrians or animals due to exposed glass and trip hazards.**

Pruning is now well underway and some of our novice pruners will be taking advantage of a free half day course on 28 February in the Perry Pear Orchard. We have a huge number of trees to prune, so if you can spare a few hours this month please do get in touch. Novices will be trained and supervised. Snowdrops are out and, if you want to split yours after flowering, we have plenty of corners which would benefit from colonising. Native daffodils have been planted and all these additions mean that walking through the community orchards will be much enhanced for the years to come.

If anyone has any tree trunks surplus to requirements, suitable for making seats up in the top wood for our school visits, please get in touch. We always need wood chip too.

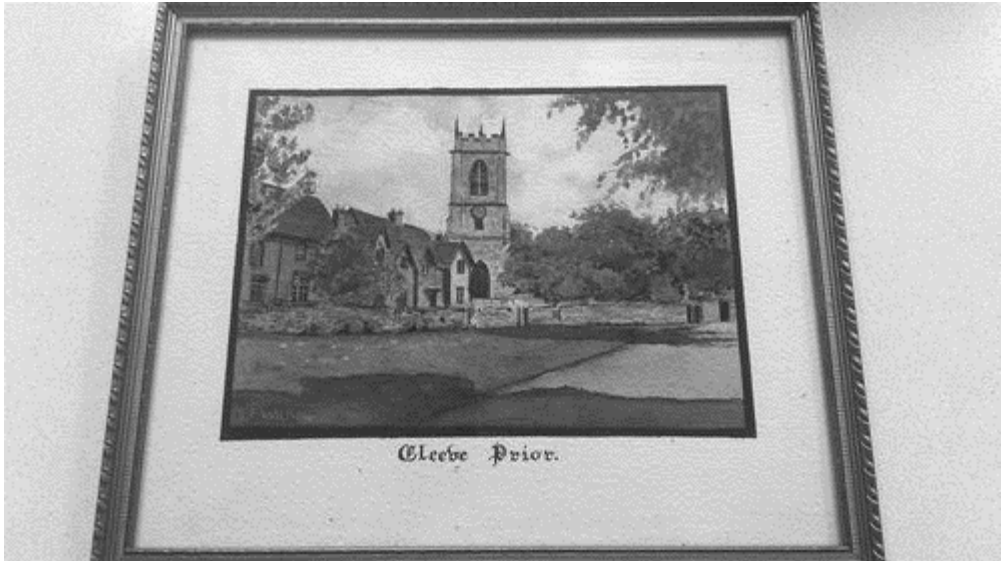
