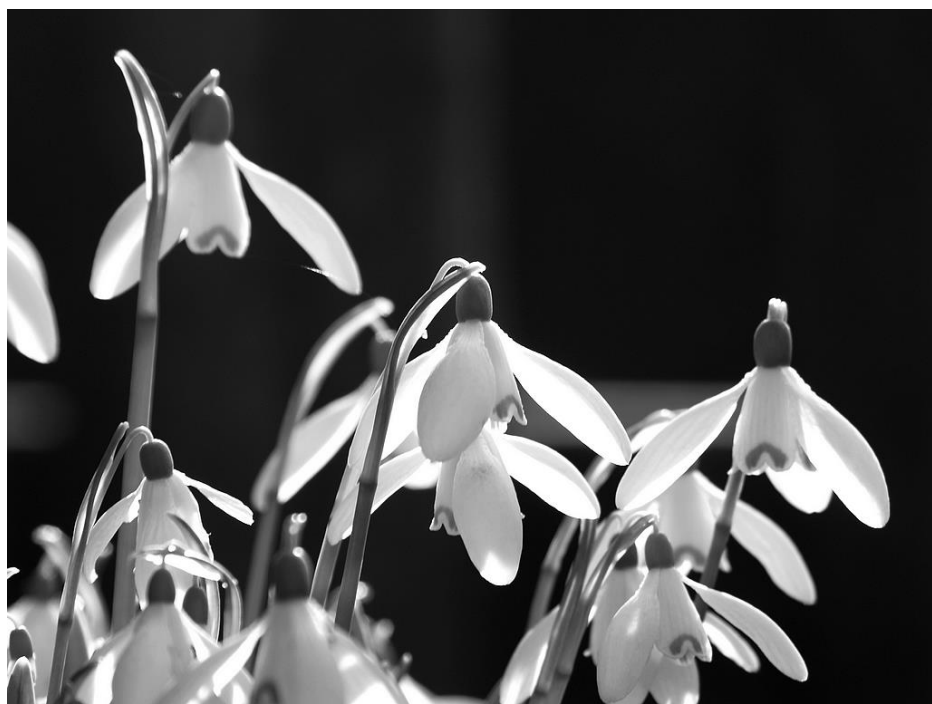

## **The Benefice of the East Vale and Avon Villages**

Our calendar year is punctuated by various special days, some of them are holidays which are familiar, but others are not so.

This year Easter is early so we start our period of Lent on 22 February which is Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday's service is where we receive ashes along with communion. The ashes are the burned ashes from last year's palm crosses. The cross of ashes on our foreheads is symbolic of Christ's death. Ash Wednesday follows Shrove Tuesday which most of us know as Pancake Day. As a child we had whip and tops at this time. They were sold in my father's shop. The tops were then coloured with chalks making pretty patterns when spinning around. We also used to take the tops to the cobblers and have a metal stud tapped into the bottom, so it spun even better, the winning top was the one that spun for the longest time. An old-fashioned tradition and one that no longer happens at Shrovetide.

Lent gives us time to reflect. Yes, we often give up a treat for Lent, a discipline to remind us of why we are taking time to reflect over the 40 days. It reminds us of the 40 days Christ spent in the wilderness. As a Benefice we can join in with the Lent course in Evesham and share our time and fellowship with others too. After all the fasting and reflection, we come to Easter, the most special time in our Christian calendar.

## **An update from the Chair**

### **Crime Matters**

Concern is regularly expressed that we are experiencing a rise in neighbourhood crime. The Parish Council meet regularly with our Police representatives for a two-way exchange about recent incidents and to hear about Police activity. We are told by the Police that there has been something of an upsurge in recent weeks involving break-ins to business premises and targeted thefts of certain types of vehicles. This is in addition to increased crime such as speeding, dog attacks and low level 'opportunity' crime. The message from the Police is that this is currently affecting a wide area and is no worse in Cleeve Prior than elsewhere. They are doing their best to deal with it and several recent arrests and recoveries of stolen goods have happened. It is a sad fact that much of the country is seeing more of these problems. There is only so much that the Police can disclose about their investigations and pro-active initiatives, but I do believe that a great deal is being done behind the scenes to identify perpetrators and deal with them. One problem the Police do have is in the (understandable) reluctance of witnesses to come forward and help in prosecutions. We all have a responsibility to maintain the highest practical levels of security regarding our own property and to report instances of crime in progress or the evidential aftermath. Calling 999 should only be used for real emergencies such as serious crime in progress and 101 should be used for all other Police reporting. By all means, inform a Parish Councillor at some stage if that is appropriate but the initial reporting of a crime should be made to an official number. The website

### **Evesham Road development**

Most people are aware that the proposal for re-development of the Evesham Road traveller site has been a long, drawn-out process. The original developer, 'West Country Development' is still pursuing their plan, albeit there seems to be a number of issues with Wychavon Planning that need to be resolved. A new developer 'Malvern Estates' appeared on the scene early in 2022 and has been constructing an alternative plan and this also has now been submitted to Wychavon Council for consideration. Malvern Estates have asked for the opportunity to address a public meeting to talk about their plan and provide an open discussion on the subject. The date of **22 February** has been agreed and this would take place in the Memorial Hall at 7.00pm. This will be advertised elsewhere for widest coverage.

Volunteers are now back at work after a short break for Christmas and the New Year. We enjoyed a Christmas party in December and Wassail Night on the traditional Twelfth Night followed by supper at the pub. If you went for a walk through the Community Orchard on 7 January and saw the bread hanging from one of the apple trees, that is why! Managing a traditional orchard involves a lot of work and the pruning season is upon us. If you could spare a few hours on a Tuesday morning to help it would be much appreciated. Training will be given if you are a novice.

Talking of planting, the 420 wild wood saplings will arrive in March for planting at Sanctuary Wood. So watch out for information on that. We don't yet know the date the trees will arrive. We are still looking into a tree dedication scheme for the wood and, as promised, will keep you posted once we have a better idea of how it will work.

Sanctuary Wood is proving to be rather a challenge, clearing the 40 years of hawthorn scrub! It is very hazardous underfoot with glass and tree stubs pointing up out of the ground. Work will continue until the end of March when we stop for the bird nesting season. Our next volunteer day there is **Tuesday 7 February, from 9.30 am** – weather permitting. Sturdy footwear and gloves essential. **Please note this area is not safe for pedestrians or animals, due to exposed glass and trip hazards.**

Despite the cooler weather our volunteers are busy on various projects and we would love to welcome new ones. There are endless tasks and every pair of hands makes the coffee break arrive sooner!!

Last season's cider proved very popular and has sold out. The new apple juice is still available at £2.50 a bottle and it is absolutely delicious. No chemicals or sprays are used on the fruit and there are no additives. The juice is pressed at the Trust and pasteurised and bottled for us in Pershore. It is great mulled too! Buy local and support your village heritage. We can deliver.

## **Cleeve Prior Ramblers**

Our first ramble of 2023 took place on 21 January. Led by Evelyn sixteen people, including two new ramblers, and five dogs assembled at the Childswickham Inn to start the circular route. The weather was cold enough to maintain a firm footing all the way round but, unfortunately, the temperature brought a heavy mist which obscured much of the views on the journey.

Nonetheless our intrepid hikers followed the path initially through Childswickham village with its characterful houses, river and church, and then through varied countryside towards Broadway. We had a coffee stop on Broadway Green where the mist cleared sufficiently to admire the beautiful Cotswold stone buildings and views of the surrounding hills.

Taking Springfield Lane near the Swan Inn, we left Broadway and crossed the railway which is the end of the GWR steam line that goes from here to Cheltenham. Gaining the countryside again, we had easy walking out to and alongside the A44 Oxford road where a short stretch led us to a turning back towards Childswickham. In clear weather one can enjoy substantial views over Broadway and across to the Malvern Hills. Regrettably not today!

A timely phone call ahead meant that on arrival at the Inn, a most pleasant lunch was served in good time.

At this time of year one inevitably takes a chance with the weather but all agreed that a congenial, pleasant and bracing walk had prefaced a welcoming lunch. Not too bad for January. The next Ramble is scheduled for 18 February.

Resettlement in the UK was difficult. It was difficult to get out of the occupied territory, for this we had to cover a very long way. We miss our families in Ukraine, especially our parents and grandparents who currently have very limited supplies of gas, electricity and water. We talk to them on most days when there is an internet connection. Now Irina is in school and both of us are trying to use our skills to find a job.

In Kherson we had our own kitchen design and assembly business. We worked together with other merchants. Here we have to start over. We repaired ourselves our house in Kherson, and Sergei and I gained a lot of

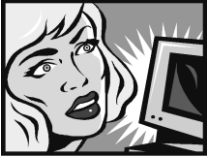
