#### The Benefice of the East Vale and Avon Villages

It was May 1969 and what appeared to be an ordinary car with a special crest on the top drove slowly through the streets of Holyhead in Anglesey with Prince Charles and his sister Anne as passengers. Earlier in the day at Caernarvon Castle was the Investiture when Charles officially became the Prince of Wales. I doubt if he noticed me. Then, one day in 2012, I was standing before the now serious, mature man he had become, concerned for others especially young people. How do I know this fact? He asked me why there was a long waiting list (at that time) for girls wanting to join Girlguiding and what could I do about it!

At the heart of the Coronation Service is a ritual in which the Archbishop of Canterbury anoints The King with oil. This custom with roots in the Old Testament, can be traced back to the Coronation of King Edgar in 973. The visible act of anointing signifies a 'setting apart' for King Charles to serve the people of our nation and the Commonwealth. Following in his mother's footsteps, his leadership is rooted in a desire and a commitment to serve, following the ways of Jesus Christ in joy-filled servant humility.

May we seek the teachings of Jesus to enable us to know his will for our lives and to serve in our local community and maybe beyond.

#### **Cleeve Prior Ramblers, 15 April**

A very impressive turnout of nineteen walkers and four lively dogs started our April Ramble from The Broom Tavern. The lovely cooking smells coming from the kitchen made us look forward to our lunch there after our walk.

The very heavy rain the day before did make for some muddy walking condition, but this did not deter us, and the dogs did not seem to notice.

We set off along the Heart of England Way encountering several stiles all of which were negotiated in style, the dogs sometimes having to be coaxed over, under or through. There were lots of sheep with their spring lambs in the extremely well fenced fields. Following the heavy rain the ditches and streams were in full spate and we crossed over a

bridge beside a raging waterfall, before arriving in Wixford, next to the Smokery.

We paused at St. Malburga's Church in Wixford which has in its grounds a rare example of a Grade II listed horse house constructed of gorse and hurdle with a thatched roof. This dates from the 18<sup>th</sup> century and was used by visiting clergy from neighbouring parishes to stable their horses whilst conducting services as St. Malburga never had its own parish priest.

Our coffee stop was reached after a gentle climb to the peak, around Oversley Castle providing us with lovely views over to the Malverns with Ragley Hall in the opposite direction. Suitably refreshed we began the return part of the ramble. We walked along the disused tree-lined railway line which had been part of the Stratford-upon-Avon and Midland Junction Railway. On returning to Broom, we saw the site of Broom junction which closed in the 1960's. We crossed the river – again almost a raging torrent – and returned to the Broom Tavern ready for the excellent lunch they provided.

We welcomed to the April meeting our distinguished speaker, Professor Nicola Watson, whose fascinating presentation on Orientalism in Gardens concentrated mainly on the history of Sezincote House and skilfully untangled the web of personalities, influences and commercial interests involved. This was an excellent preparation for our visit there in June.

We first heard about The Nabob, a comedy play by Samuel Foote premiered in June 1772, satirising the behaviour of those returning much enriched from their spell with the East India Company (EIC) and attempting to buy their way into high society.

Sezincote House, built in 1805, was designed by Samuel Pepys Cockerell, a great-great nephew of Samuel Pepys and a surveyor for the EIC, who had never travelled to India but drew his influence from drawings and engravings. His brother Colonel John Cockerell had bought the estate on his return from Bengal where he too worked for the EIC and after his death it was inherited by another brother, Sir Charles Cockerell. It is a notable example of Neo-Mughal architecture which in turn inspired the Brighton Pavilion after a visit by the Prince Regent in 1807.

Cockerell had already employed Indian elements at Daylesford House nearby, built for Warren Hastings, first Governor-General of British India. This design was a fusion of Persian, Indian and other styles and included white marble and red sandstone, harking back to the Taj Mahal completed in 1648.



Sezincote has its roots in the tradition of British country houses, which were typically built as grand rural residences for the aristocracy. The estate features a large house with extensive gardens, parkland, and other landscape features that are typical of English country estates. However, Sezincote House is built of typical Mughal red sandstone with a copper-covered dome, a distinctive blend of Indian and English architectural styles, characterized by its domes, minarets, and horseshoe-

shaped arches. It presents an astonishing vision to unsuspecting Cotswold ramblers!

The landscape was designed by Humphry Repton, essentially Renaissance in style with Hindu and Islamic elements featuring Mughal gardens, serpent fountains, temples, and Nandi bulls guarding the estate. It is still privately owned and managed by a brother and sister with support from both older and younger generations. Our visit to Sezincote is planned for the afternoon of 15 June.
