The Home Upgrade Grant is ready!

Government funding is now available for free energy improvements to make homes warmer and reduce energy bills for eligible households in Worcestershire.

Who is Eligible?

Homeowners and private tenants may be eligible if they meet the following criteria: Have a household income of £31,000 or less, or the property is located in a government defined low-income postcode.

Have an EPC rating of a D or below – for homes that do not have a current/valid EPC certificate, an assessment can be funded if they meet all other criteria, The property doesn't have mains gas central heating,

Pay council tax to Redditch Borough, or Bromsgrove, Malvern Hill or Wychavon District Councils. Those who are exempt will be asked to provide other evidence to satisfy they have an eligible postcode.

Once this has been collated, the Road Safety Team will be able to address the area of concern and action appropriately.

Your local officers have been working very closely with our local housing associations and meetings are had regularly to share information regarding ongoing cases that are relevant to both partner agencies.



Reports of Rogue Traders (Nottingham Knockers), 18 January, from West Mercia Police

Over the past few days we have received several reports of rogue traders / Nottingham Knockers active in the villages around Evesham.

These traders will not have the correct licences to sell door to door and the products that they sell may be sub-standard and you may be overcharged for the product. (They are normally young lads who turn up on your doorstep with a huge black holdall full of cleaning products ranging from tea towels, dishcloths and dusters to sprays, polishes and even small clothing items. Initially they all came from the Nottingham area, obtaining their goods from a warehouse at Clifton just outside Nottingham and they then come 'knocking' on your door to trade, hence the term 'Nottingham Knockers'.)

We are encouraging all residents to be vigilant, not to purchase any items and report any such incidents using 101 or the online reporting form in non-emergencies.

Officers from the local SNT will be carrying out reassurance patrols in your area.
